Photo competition



A weekend in Brackelsham

After a long week of work, on a Friday evening, we set off for a dive trip to Brackelsham. We both were very excited about the dives which we would endeavour over the next few days. This would be our second dive trip to the coast. We had our first dives in Portland harbour, which was an amazing, unforgettable experience, yet this time we would dive in the open sea. I was a little bit anxious about the likely 'drift dive', as I have never experienced underwater currents.

We arrived to our destination at about 10 pm. The night was warm and wind was calm, all promising nice weather for the next day. We have met the other divers at a caravan park. All nine of us were happy to share a caravan. It was fun to stay all together - people shared amazing scuba-diving stories and we had some good laughs.



After everyone went to sleep, me and Cheryl were still 'full of beans', and our laughs continued until we heard knocking on the wall from another room, and a voice say 'Go to sleep!'...

We woke up at about 6 am on Saturday morning. It was very sunny already. Huge queue to the shower room... Nevertheless, queue was disappearing quickly, everyone was good with time and cooperation.

Had a quick breakfast and a cuppa, packed all our dive gear and set off to a car park. Wayne and Caz towed the RIB, and we all followed to the shore. There was a nice surprise- a gorgeous grey seal resting lavishly on the beach. We could come fairly close

to him to have a look and take some pictures. I have never seen a grey seal in a wild before (*ed: this was BEFORE Alicija went to the Farne Isles*).

On that day, Sanjaya had his first two dives with Alex E. I had a pleasure to dive with Tony and Alex

Sadly, we were unable to locate one of the wrecks which we wanted to dive, so 'first wave' divers explored a seabed. Dived up to 15 meters, visibility was very good in these shallow waters, saw a lot of crabs, colourful fish and all the other amazing sea life.

On the second wave, we dives a wreck from the WWII. To me, this was the most fascinating dive so

far, as I had a number of 'firsts' on this dive, and they are always very special: I have held a big colourful crab in my hand, I have experienced the currents of the sea, and have seen so many different fish

and other sea life for the first time.

On a Sunday weather still was fantastic. We all had one dive each that day, and it was also pretty remarkable. We dived a sea bed in the shallows again, but this time current was much stronger than the day before. Sanjaya came from his dive saying he felt like he was 'flying' under water. It is truly amazing to feel the enormous power of the sea, taking you wherever it may... But with good preparation and skill, it is possible to control your direction and completely enjoy the dive. Massive thanks to dive trip organiser Caz, and everyone else, who made this trip so amazing, safe and fun!

Dry dive at London Hyperbaric

A dry dive is a great opportunity to experience diving to depth, and the associated physiological problems of narcosis, breathing dense air and the pressure on the body without the risks associated with going underwater. Whipps Cross hospital is the home of the London Hyperbaric Chamber and 10 members of the club went there on a blazing hot Sunday in July (the day of the Wimbledon tennis men's final) to carry out a



dry dive to 40 metres equivalent pressure (5 atm).

This is an experience that you have to do to fully

understand; but at a depth of 40 metres it can be likened to being put in a hot closed box with a group of mildly drunk people! the effect of nitrogen narcosis was apparent to all involved very quickly (some quicker than others!) and we all had a great experience.

Thanks to the attendants and staff at the chamber for putting on a great day for us!
